


Our guest blogger this week is Ethan. He's in Australia!

COOL CANBERRA!

This week's guest blogger Ethan Moore goes to a fantastic city 'down under'*...

What is the capital city of Australia? Sydney? Melbourne perhaps? No, it's Canberra. Canberra isn't big, like Sydney. And it isn't as old as Melbourne. It's a new city, about a hundred years old. Its population is only 300,000 people. But it's a good city to live in. Three people who live here tell us why Canberra is so good.



Hi. My name's Chia. I love my city! My family is from China but I'm Australian, too. Canberra is small and the people are very friendly. It's great for shopping and it's also very good for jobs. My friends all have good jobs here. They are doctors, receptionists and IT worker. I'm an office worker – I work in a big building in the city centre. But it's only 15 minutes from my house.



Hello. I'm Bill and I'm 24. My wife and I are from Sydney. Sydney is a great city but it's really expensive. A small house costs about \$600,000! We can't afford that – I'm a teacher and my wife's a shop assistant. That's why we live in Canberra. It isn't very cheap here but it's less expensive than Sydney. Now we have a small house and we're very happy.



I'm Karen and I'm an engineer – hi! For me, Canberra is the perfect city because it's so beautiful. The city centre is very clean and it's next to a big lake. You are never far from the countryside, and it's easy to get to – just ten minutes away in the car or on your bike! And of course the sky is blue and the weather is perfect for being outside – it's Australia!
