The top and bottom of the world

The Arctic, at the top of the world, and the Antarctic, at the bottom, are the coldest places on Earth. They are both covered in snow, but there are many differences between the two regions.

The Arctic is an ocean covered in ice which stretches over six different countries (Canada, USA, Greenland, Russia, Norway and Iceland). The Antarctic is land covered in ice, and is a continent, Antarctica, that is not part of any country. It is also classified as a desert!

Many indigenous peoples have lived in the Arctic for thousands of years and have adapted to life in extreme conditions. About 4 million people live in the region today. But the only people who go to Antarctica are scientists and some tourists. There are about 5,000 people in summer, but only 1,000 in winter.

Winter is from November to March in the Arctic, and from March to October in the Antarctic. During the winter, people have to live for several months in permanent darkness. There is no sun but it is possible to see beautiful colours in the sky called the northern lights or southern lights.

Finally, there are differences in the animals you can see. Did you know that there are no penguins in the Arctic? There are many other birds and animals though, for example, reindeer, polar bears and foxes. There aren't so many different animals in the Antarctic, but there are lots of penguins!
